AA WHITSUNDAYS CRUISE

Unity on the high seas: The Story of AA's First Ever Australian Cruise Celebrating 80 Years

From February 15-19, 2025, over 400 AA and Al-Anon members embarked on the AA80 Whitsunday Cruise, as part of the celebrations marking 80 years of Alcoholics Anonymous in Australia. The cruise sailed from Brisbane to the Whitsunday Islands, with a stop at Airlie Beach, offering a unique adventure for celebration, fellowship, and spiritual growth.

The Journey to the Cruise:

The idea for the cruise originated in 2019, inspired by similar events in the U.S. However, the pandemic forced a delay, and the event was initially planned for 2021 before being rescheduled. In 2023, after receiving support from the AA Board of Trustees, the planning resumed, culminating in the cruise's realization in 2025. A "Cruise for Two" raffle helped fund the event, and OzCruising handled all bookings and logistics.

The Cruise Experience:

On February 15, the AA80 Whitsunday Cruise set sail with over 400 attendees.

A highlight was the main AA meeting, where members sang "Happy Birthday" to AA Australia. The onboard AA meetings, held in the Black Circus Auditorium, allowed for fellowship and sharing, with around 390 members participating in 90-minute sessions. A raffle system was used to ensure everyone had a chance to share.



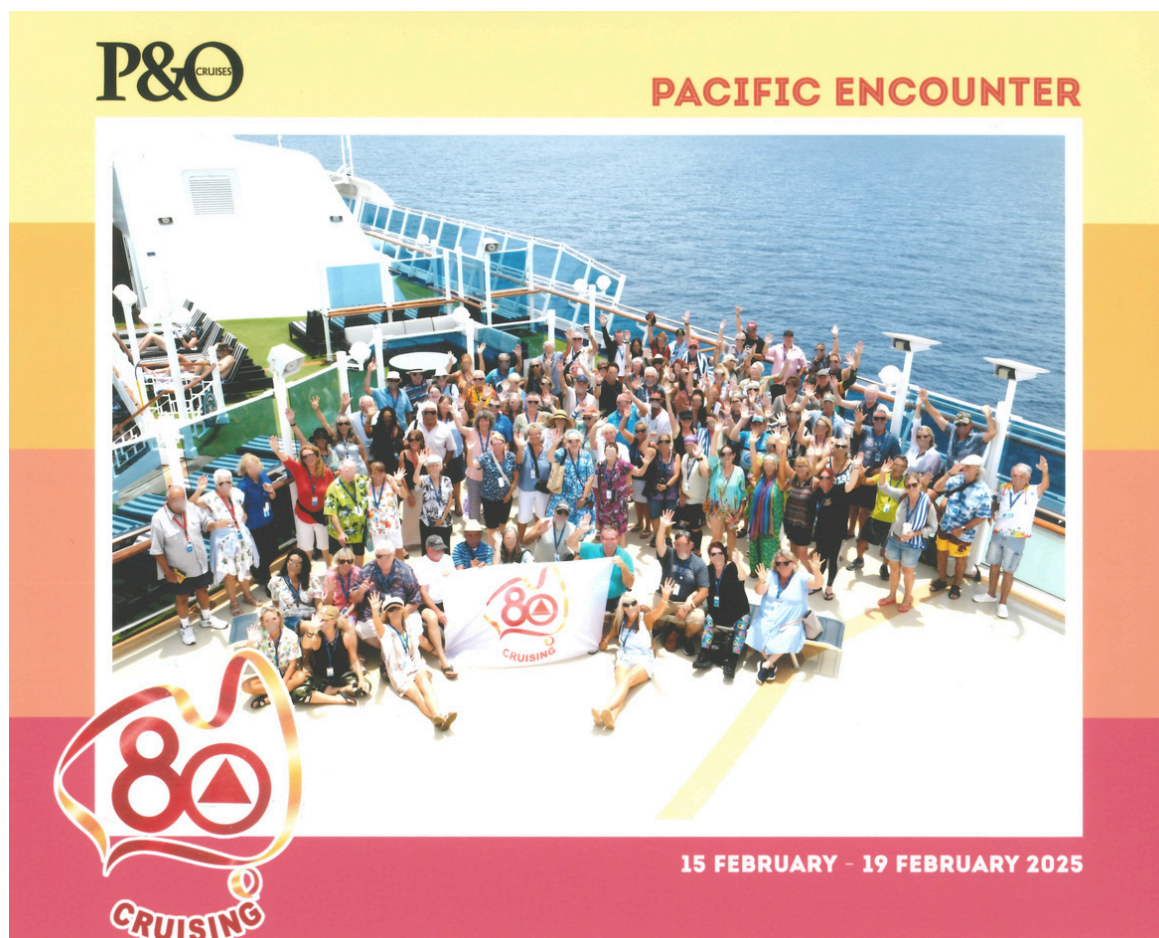
Al-Anon members also gathered in the Blue Room, and many spontaneous AA meetings took place across the ship. The atmosphere was filled with laughter and joy, creating a vibrant, supportive environment for all attendees.

Exclusive AA80-themed merchandise, including t-shirts and a limited-edition wall clock, were available, with one clock being won as a lucky door prize. The cruise attendees unanimously expressed their desire for a second cruise.

A Special Moment at Airlie Beach:

On Day 3, the ship docked at Airlie Beach, where local member Reece hosted an AA meeting at the Sailing Club, attracting over 100 attendees. The meeting was a success, and the AA80 Cruise committee donated the 7th Tradition funds to the local AA group to support their efforts.



Self-Supporting and Looking Ahead:

The cruise was fully self-supporting, funded by the raffle. Surplus funds of \$1,120 were donated to the 2025 AA80 Host Planning Committee. Feedback from attendees was overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing interest in future AA cruises.

The AA80 Whitsunday Cruise was a beautiful celebration of AA's 80th anniversary in Australia, exemplifying the power of fellowship in recovery. Thanks to all those who contributed, and a special thanks to our Higher Powers for guiding the event.

CONFERENCE 2025 - IN OUR 80th YEAR

The 2025 Conference theme explained

As we celebrate the 80th anniversary of AA in Australia this month at the National Convention in Sydney, we also look forward to the 2025 General Service Conference, set to take place in November. It is our national group conscience - at its best, a reflection of the collective spirit of AA across the broad Australian nation as we seek to reach the suffering alcoholic in our midst.

Over the past 80 years, countless alcoholics have found a new way of life through AA in Australia. Countless more still to come unknowingly rely on us to keep AA in great condition, ensuring that the hand of AA will always be there when they reach out for help. As any significant milestone does, our 80th anniversary reminds us to reflect on why we are here, and what's really important.

Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics achieve sobriety. This simple mission is at the heart of everything we do. It guides our meetings, our service work, and our interactions with newcomers. It reminds us that, regardless of how AA evolves, the solution we offer is the same one that worked for the first 100 members and continues to work today. As we approach our 80th year, we may ask ourselves: how are we living up to our responsibility to carry the message? Are we extending the hand of AA to those who need it? What new challenges do we face today, and how does the experience of AA equip us to face them?

The General Service Conference is an opportunity for us to face these questions at the national level. Our 80th Anniversary may remind us that while the world around us changes, the need for one alcoholic working with another, sharing experience, strength and hope, remains just as vital as it was eighty years ago. As we celebrate this milestone, let us recommit to the principles that have sustained us and ensure that AA in Australia continues to provide *haven at last* for those who we hope will find us.

AA On the Inside

To members who have had experience with AA in Australian correctional facilities – we need your help.

According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, as of June 2024, there were 44,403 adult prisoners being held in 116 Australian correctional facilities throughout Australia: 3,432 female and 40,957 male, 15% of whom are Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander. Of the current prison population, 60% have been imprisoned previously and a staggering 44% have reported alcohol related harm in the twelve months prior to their incarceration.

Contemplating these statistics, our slogan *But for the Grace of God* must surely come to mind. And, as Bill reminds us, in the forward to the Second Edition of our Big Book-

‘...we shall never be able to touch more than a fair fraction of the alcohol problem in all its ramifications.’

Nevertheless, in an attempt to reach at least a fair fraction of this vast number of our incarcerated brothers and sisters, conference has issued the following advisory action.

Advisory Action #016/2024

An anthology of stories from Australian members about Correctional Facilities be developed, similar to the Message Stick.

As a ‘message stick’ to alcoholics on the inside, this small project could potentially have a profound effect on the prison population in this country.

In order to make it happen, the conference working group is calling on members throughout Australia who have experienced incarceration, or know of those who have, to submit their stories to us. We are also calling on those AA members across Australia who have experience in carrying the AA message into Correctional Facilities to share the service stories.

The US Grapevine regularly produces compilations of stories with a single theme, of which *Free On the Inside – Stories of AA Recovery in Prison* (available from GSO) is a fine example.

And we are committed to producing a book just as fine and as a worthy follow up to the inspiring Message Stick. Hopefully, with AA On the Inside we can penetrate far into the corrections system, especially where we have difficulty reaching prisoners any other way, be it bureaucracy or simply because we do not have the troops on the ground. So, let’s get this happening.

Story Guidelines

If you would like to submit your story, below are a few simple guidelines:

1. Remember our trusted format: What we used to be like, what happened, and what we are like now.
2. Keep the word count to around 2000 words (not mandatory)

And keep in mind:

- Your story may be edited for clarity, brevity or grammar.
- For editorial reasons, your story may not be included in the final publication.
- If your story is accepted, you will be asked to sign a release form. The story, as written, will then become the property of the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous, as is the usual practice.

The committee may also consider submission of recorded stories on the understanding that these stories will need to be transcribed and may also be subject to the conditions stated above. Remember your story could save a life.

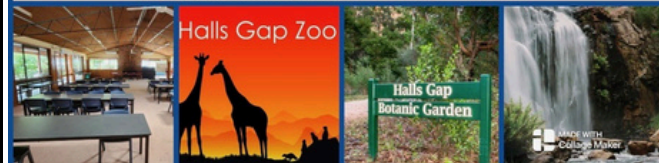
