A New Chapter for AA in Australia: Carrying the Message in the Digital Age

Over the past few years, Alcoholics Anonymous in Australia has quietly been undergoing one of its most significant transformations since the Fellowship first came to these shores — not in our Traditions or our message, but in the way we share it with the world.

The Vision and the Beginning

It began, as many good things in AA do, with a question: Are we doing enough to reach the still-suffering alcoholic?

Advisory actions from several General Service Conferences affirmed what many of us already felt — that our national digital presence needed to reflect the strength, unity and accessibility of AA itself. Members across the country recognised that the internet is now the first place people turn when they realise they need help.

If we wanted AA to remain visible, approachable and relevant, we had to lift our online profile and offer a genuine path to recovery — one that feels human, hopeful, trustworthy, and above all, a credible source of support for anyone, anywhere. After all, Alcoholics Anonymous has been Australia's longest-running solution to alcoholism since 1945 — built on connection, service and shared experience.

So began the project to redevelop aa.org.au and its connected sites — including members.aa.org.au and literature.aa.org.au — a national digital ecosystem designed to serve newcomers, members and trusted servants alike.

Built on Unity and Service

From the very beginning, this has been a Fellowship-driven effort — shaped by advisory actions, overseen by the General Service Board, and carried forward by the General Service Office, volunteers, developers, designers and IT specialists. Through it all, the project has remained grounded in a single purpose: to carry the message of recovery through modern means, while keeping its spiritual heart intact.

After years of groundwork, the new aa.org.au quietly went live in a soft launch on 14 October 2025 — a milestone that marks both a beginning and a continuation. The soft launch allowed the team to gather feedback, fine-tune content and ensure a smooth transition for members and newcomers alike before the full national rollout. Each site has been built with accessibility and simplicity in mind — readable for everyone, on any device, and compliant with WCAG standards. Every decision, from colour palette to content structure, has been made with care: to honour our Traditions while embracing the opportunities of 2025 and beyond.

A Living Project, Always Evolving

The work continues. As with sobriety itself, there is no “final version.” Our digital presence will keep growing — through better analytics, improved search visibility, richer stories of recovery and stronger pathways for connection. What matters most is that we keep listening, learning and evolving together. The internet may change, but our purpose does not: to ensure that when someone types words like “how to stop drinking,” AA is there — clear, welcoming and ready to offer hope.

Gratitude and Growth

This project has reminded us that technology, when guided by service and unity, can be a powerful spiritual tool. Every line of code, every page, every story carries the same message that has been passed from one alcoholic to another for ninety years: “Give freely of what you find and join us.”

Who We Are: A Snapshot of AA in Australia

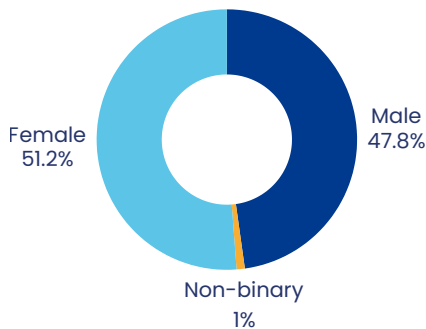
Every few years, Alcoholics Anonymous invites members across Australia to share a snapshot of who we are — how we connect, recover, and serve. The 2025 Membership Survey drew responses from more than 1,200 members, offering a picture of our Fellowship today.

The results show a Fellowship rich in experience and diversity. More than 60 % of members are aged 50 or over, and participation between men and women is now nearly equal. Regional engagement continues to grow, with 27.5 % of members living outside major cities (up from 22.2 % in 2022).

Referrals from medical and treatment professionals remain a key pathway into AA, rising to 33.8 % of new members — the highest figure since surveys began. Most members report no barriers to attending meetings, though some highlighted opportunities to improve accessibility, transport, and flexibility — all reflecting a shared desire to keep the AA message open to anyone, anywhere, who needs it.

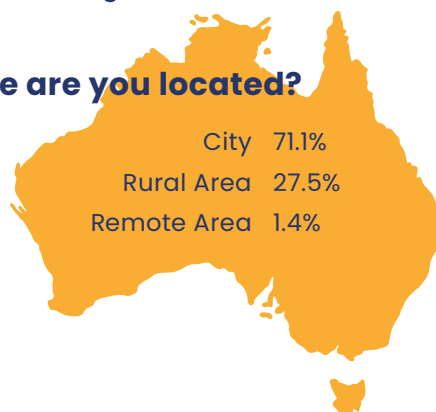
Age Distribution

- 80+ > 4.0%

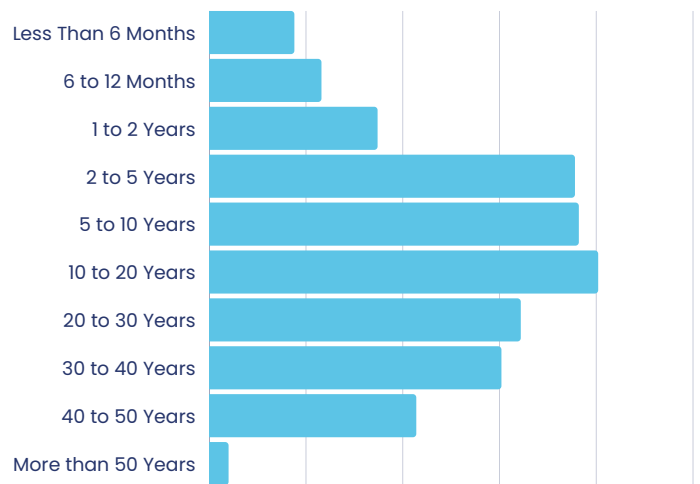


Our members come from all parts of Australia, with strong representation from those over 50 and growing participation from regional areas.

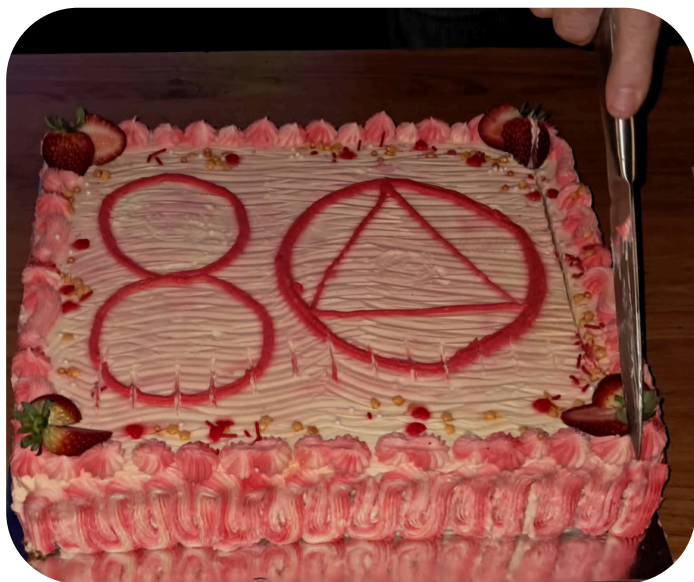
Celebrating 80 Years of AA in Australia - Banana Coast District Style

2025 marks 80 years of Alcoholics Anonymous in Australia, and what a year of unity and celebration it has been. After the inaugural AA80 Cruise in February and the main event at Sydney Town Hall over Easter, the Banana Coast District of Alcoholics Anonymous hosted its own vibrant AA80 celebration weekend in August at the Coffs Harbour Showground.

For the first time, the Grafton and Coffs Harbour Fellowships came together to create one big weekend of fellowship, service, and joy. AS visitors arrived on the Friday evening, they were welcomed with a warm cup of soup and a bun. Before the welcome AA meeting commenced, the celebrations opened with an original AA80 song, now available through the AA Tape Library.

The organising committee proudly wore red “Volunteer” T-shirts gifted from the Sydney AA80 event, a powerful symbol of unity in service. That spirit of togetherness shone brightly as the committee welcomed more than 220 visitors from near and far. The atmosphere was electric—so much laughter and chatter filled the air that our wonderful MC often had to call the room to order before meetings began!

A lively raffle added to the fun, with beautiful prizes including handcrafted AA rings made by a local jeweller, an AA80 Commemorative Big Book, a large canvas painting by a member, and unique AA80 branded coffee mugs.



The highlight for many was the AA80 Birthday Party Disco & Pizza Night. Imagine sixty large pizzas spread across tables, feeding over 130 enthusiastic dancers.

Before the music began, everyone joined in singing Happy Birthday to AA in Australia, followed by slices of a specially decorated AA80 birthday cake.

Not a crumb of pizza or cake was left, and the dance floor came alive under the guidance of a professional DJ.

ChatNow - AA Service From Home!

They say there is a job for everyone in Alcoholics Anonymous. Do you have a desire to be of service in AA? Do you have a computer (laptop or desktop)? Do you want to help the still sick and suffering alcoholic yet to find us? Would you like to make a difference from the comfort of your own home?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, then a role as a ChatNow Responder on our national website may be the service job for you! This service opportunity is ideal for anyone wanting to be involved in AA service, especially for members who may live remotely, or have difficulty attending and being involved in traditional service roles at their homegroup, District or Area. Technology has enabled us to not only reach more people who seek AA's help but has also provided a unique opportunity for the members of AA anywhere in Australia to serve.

Since ChatNow (funded by AA groups from all over Australia) launched in November 2023 we have onboarded over 30 trained Responders from all over Australia (AA members like you). Through this service these Responders have connected with people needing the support of AA through over 53,000 chats. Of these, approximately one third have been people who have reached out to AA for the very first time. That's over 17,000 chats where an AA member has been on the other end of the computer to offer help to a newcomer.

Our Responders operate in two-hour shifts, with each Responder taking two shifts per week (time off is available when needed for holidays, work travel etc). Each Responder gets to choose the time windows that best suit their schedule for shifts, and the team supports one another when the unexpected happens and shift changes are needed.

Our Responder community stays connected through six-weekly meetings and ad hoc connection to provide support, guidance and a few laughs along the way. The ChatNow service operates daily from 10am to 10pm – our first batch of responders who began in 2023 are rotating on from their positions in November this year, so there are slots available for the next batch of willing servants to fill!

Extensive training is provided to help new Responders get familiar with the easy-to-use platform, typical queries and responses. Several of our Responders have commented on the impact that service through ChatNow has had on their recovery – for some this is the most meaningful service they've undertaken in AA to date.
