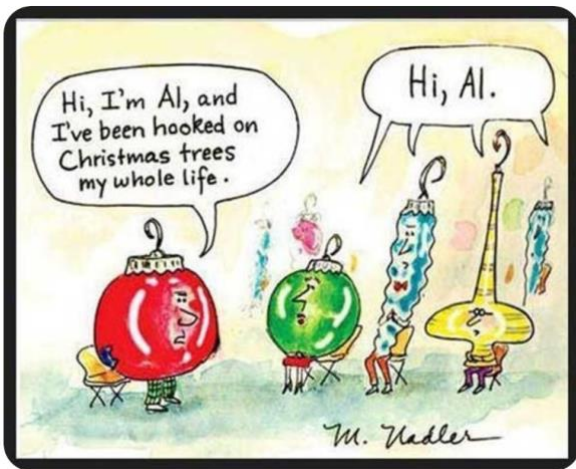
Again, delegates were given plenty of opportunity to ask the accountant for any explanation on queries.

The grey cloud of the Coronavirus has its silver lining in AA's discovery of our ability to correspond virtually via the internet. In the past much communication between World Service Delegates was restricted to two yearly intervals between the World Service and AOSM face-to-face meetings themselves. The internet has overcome the tyranny of distance and regular meetings of the various committees associated with World Service and AOSM are now possible.

In our efforts to assist our neighbouring countries, Brian S, Second Term Delegate, presented a two day workshop on the Traditions (on Zoom) for an international group. He also presented a two day workshop over two weeks on the 12 Traditions for members in Hong Kong.

Since this year's AOSM was virtual there was scope for younger (in AA terms) countries, who might have been restricted by finances, to join the meeting. In addition, a virtual AOSM gave us the ability to allow many more "Observers" into the meeting and some Delegates took up this opportunity.

Meetings with former Australian World Service Delegates continue each month with valuable sharing of information. Former Delegates appreciate being kept informed of happenings in the Fellowship and, in turn, their knowledge and experience is advantageous to the present Delegates.
