2026 AA National Combined Services Forum

What's the Event About?

The committee is busy planning for the 2026 National Combined Service Forum in October. Canberra will host the Forum this year, you may have been at the Adelaide event in 2024. Add these dates to your diary for the weekend of 2-4 October.

Members from local Groups and Area committees across Australia are warmly invited. If you are active in a group doing service or want to know more about what's happening, this is the event for you. The National Forum is held every two years and is the only national third legacy event on the AA Calendar.

Come along and meet others from around Australia and exchange ideas. The program will include a full range of service activities. For members active in service be there and tell us about the work your group is doing. It's a great chance for you and your sponsees to share about the events you've held and your plans.

The program development is guided by the question "what is the message?". The event will have two main focuses: current service activities and understanding how they help us in recovery.

Have you arranged tickets yet?

A maximum of 300 tickets are available. Choose the options that suit your group.

It's easy to get here by plane, train, bus, or car. The venue has ample parking. We recommend you make bookings for travel as early as possible. The weekend of 2-4 October falls during the school holidays. Floriade will be on and it's a great attraction if you want to stay longer and bring your family.

What's On over the Weekend

There will be a variety of sessions. Pick from seminars, workshops and presentations to hear from AA members delivering services to the community.

These include:

- Service in correctional and treatment facilities
- Accessibility in AA
- Support for young people in AA
- The AA Virtual Area
- Help for remote communities
- Public Information events and Public awareness

Other sessions will cover the national first-contact support tools. These include the 1300 Help Line, Web Chat, and online meetings.

History buffs will gain fascinating insights from the AA national Archivist about key moments in our history.

There will be a Dinner after the busy all-day program on Saturday.

Why I Love the ChatNow Responder Service

My beginnings in AA were in a small country town with 2 male members and a meeting once a week. I didn't have a phone on and even if I did I would not have been able to afford the STD calls. At around 8 months sober I was the only one left to open the doors and being remote it was a lonely existence.

Joining loners international was a Godsend and as I developed a habit to go to the Post Office to check for mail, it was a saviour when once I decided that sobriety was too hard and I would go and drink. By checking the mail box, I received experience, strength and hope and did not get drunk. After a few years of recovery I got a position with a Government Department and decided to join an online email meeting after arriving back at work on the Monday I freaked out as there were so many emails I thought I would get fired. Service was my saving grace and I kept the meeting open for 7 years and attended round ups for my AA injections.

I eventually left the outback and headed into the city where I got a face to face sponsor and went through the big book and the steps. And have done service at group, district (also telephone helpline), area, convention committee and also been a delegate.

However, I believe that this ChatNow service is one of the best roles I have been involved with for the following reasons:

- I respond to people from all walks of life, different professionals and families
- We provide assistance to at least 23 newcomers on a daily basis
- There is a great committee that assists with any issues or sticky chats and they are also available for a debrief after a difficult session
- I found I am good at researching for some of the difficult questions from people in different countries
- Having a good level of computer skills is very beneficial to the role but the system has a lot of canned responses so you don't need to retype the same answers all the time
- The requirement is for 2 x 2 hour shifts per week and as my hobbies are genealogy and photography both utilise the computer so if the chats are slow I have plenty to keep me occupied

WHAT'S HAPPENING

The Seventh Tradition: Supporting Our Fellowship Together

Our literature tells us that we are fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions. While these words are familiar, their meaning is worth revisiting. The Seventh Tradition is more than a guideline—it is a shared responsibility that keeps our fellowship strong, united, and free.

At the group level, members contribute during meetings, helping to cover basic expenses and ensure that our doors remain open to anyone seeking recovery. But the responsibility does not end there. These funds are not intended to remain solely within the group. They are collected on behalf of Alcoholics Anonymous as a whole and are meant to be passed along to districts, areas, and General Service, where they support essential services.

When we allow contributions to flow beyond our group, we help carry the message further than we ever could alone. These funds support literature, outreach, and the vital work that connects newcomers to the hope we have found.

When we hold onto excess funds, two things can happen. We may unintentionally keep money that was never ours to retain, and more importantly, we limit the fellowship's ability to reach those still suffering. The Seventh Tradition calls us to trust the process—to give freely, knowing that our contributions will be used where they are needed most.

A fully functioning fellowship relies on the faithful practice of this Tradition. It allows us to remain independent while ensuring that resources, including literature income, can be directed back into carrying the message to the wider community.

As we reflect on the Seventh Tradition, we are reminded that every contribution matters. Each act of giving is a quiet expression of unity and purpose—helping to ensure that when someone reaches out for help, Alcoholics Anonymous is there.

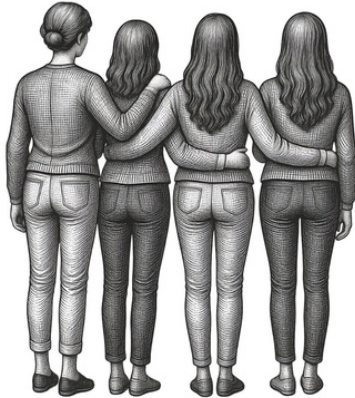
